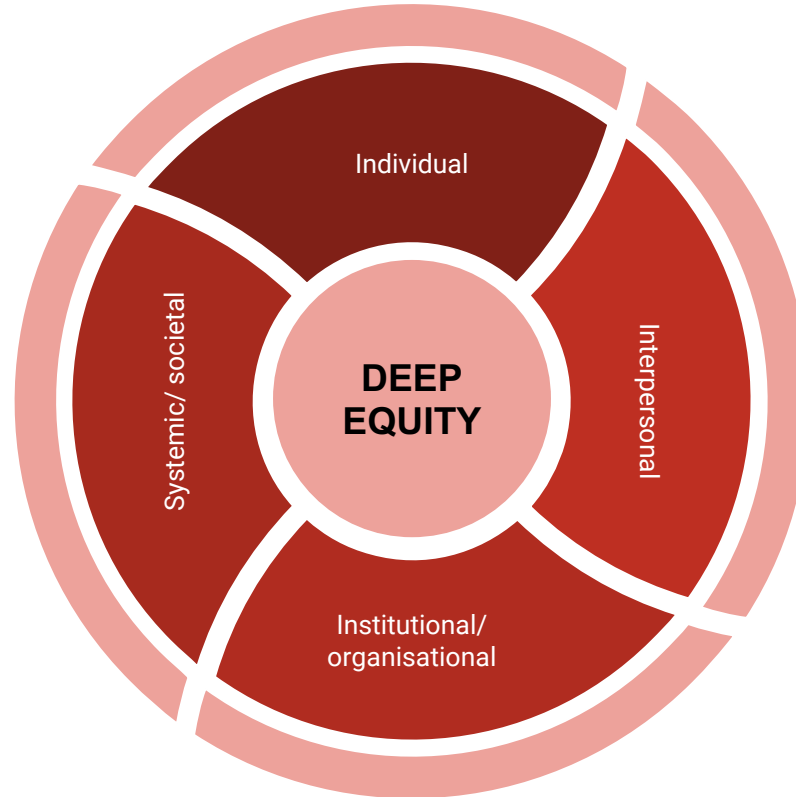
Ako Ōtautahi - Learning City

WHY THIS CONVERSATION?

- Those with less social capital do not have the same access to learning opportunities.
- COVID-19 accentuated this issue and affected different communities in different ways
- Predicted technological and demographic change increase the urgency for us to activate new and more equitable approaches to learning.

Equity is ultimately about: How do we be more human together and create social and environmental conditions on the planet where all can thrive and share their gifts?

Generating actions to support, enable and influence increased Digital Equity in our community so that people can fully participate in learning opportunities.

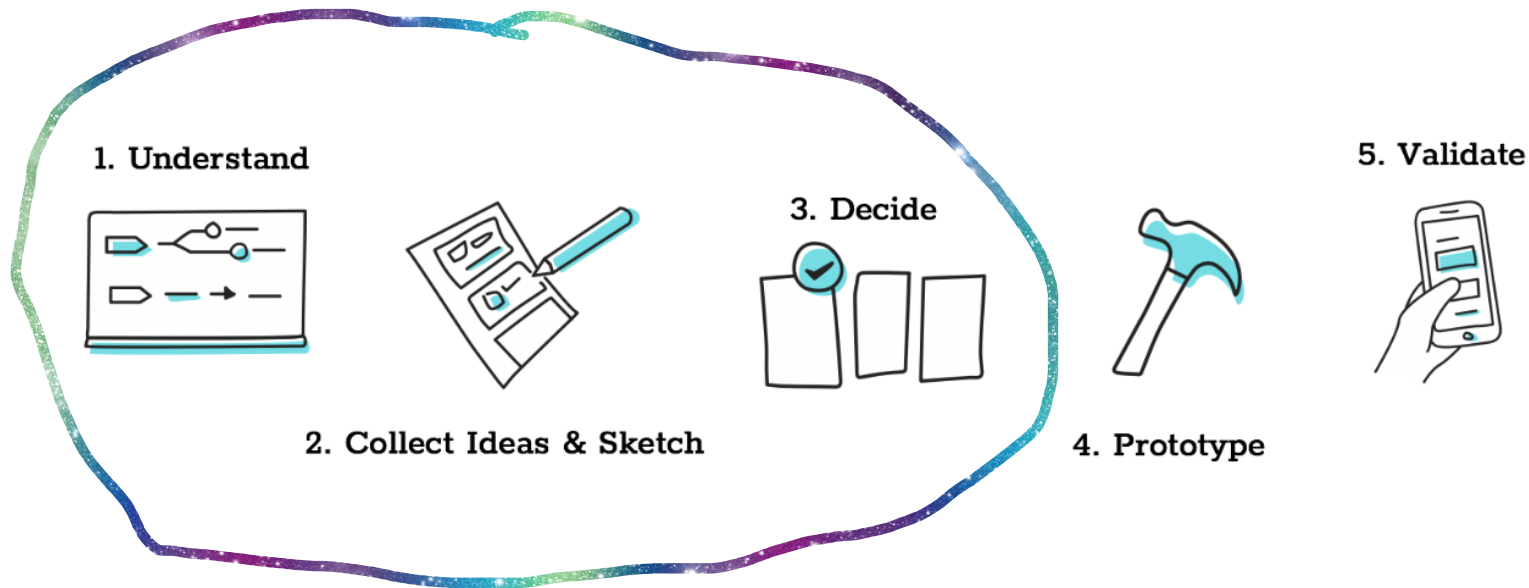


Group Insights and Ideation

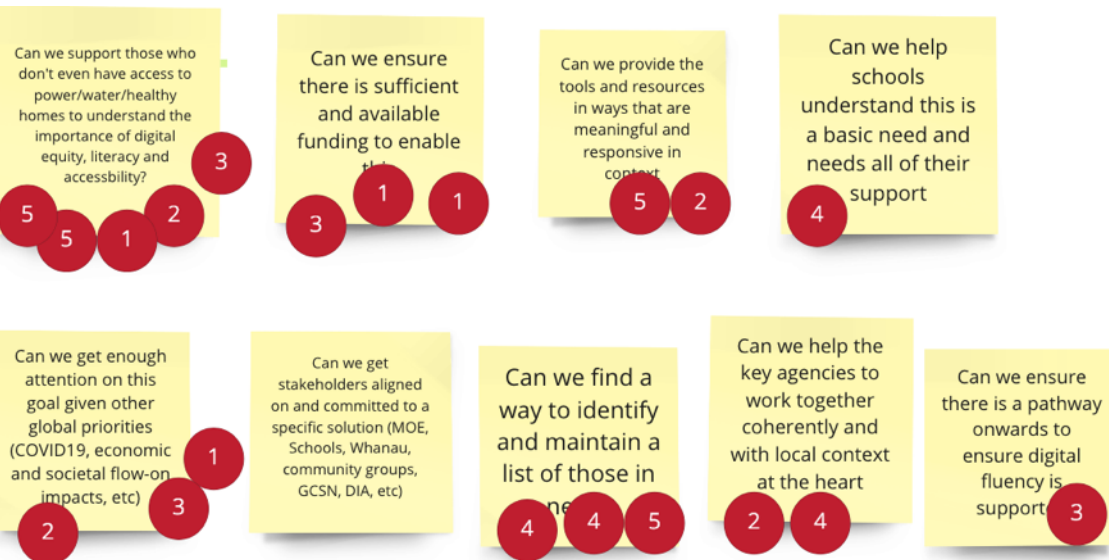

“Can we...”

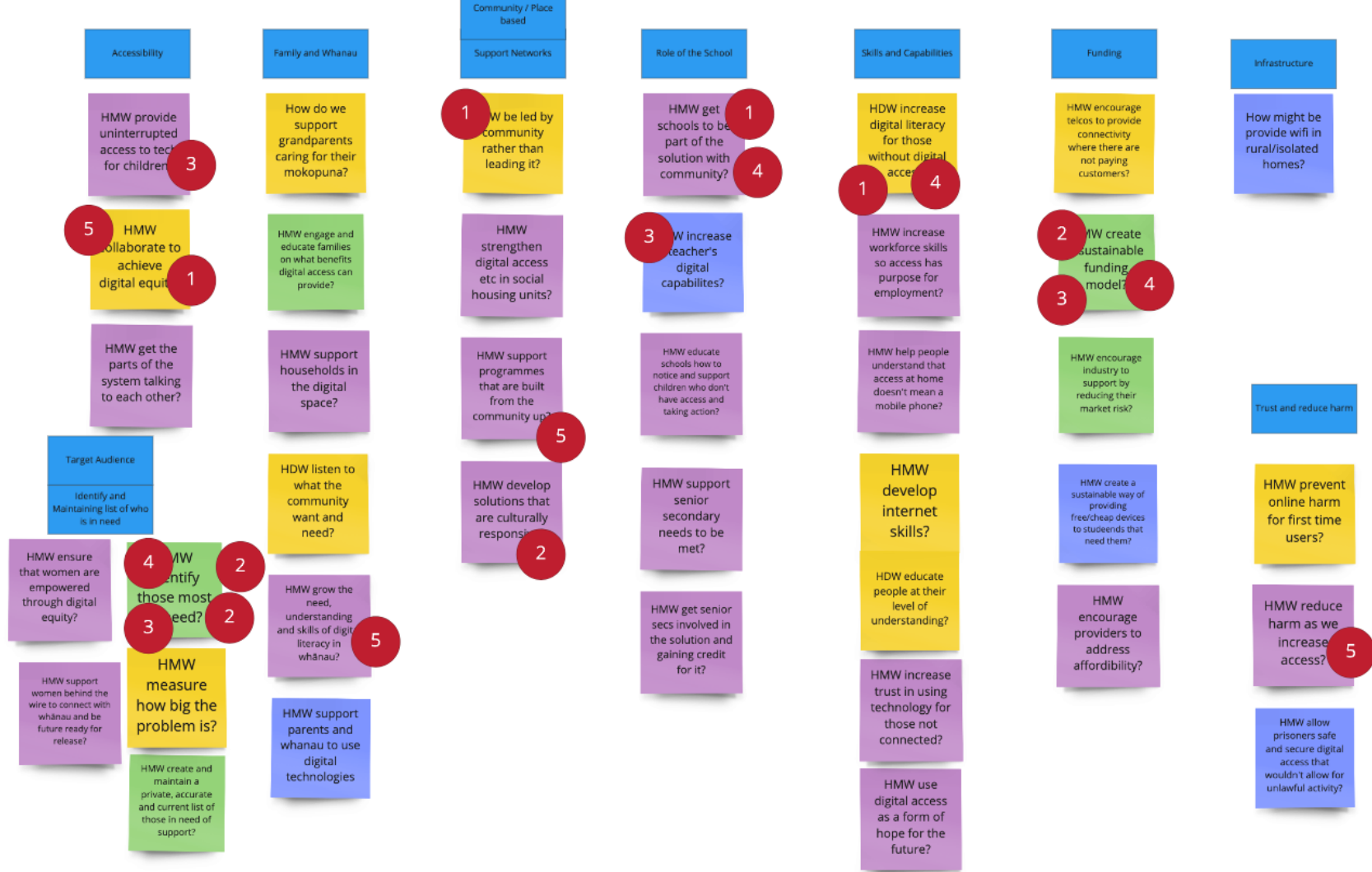
- Support those who don't even have access to power / water / healthy homes to understand the importance of digital equity, literacy and accessibility?

"Which questions do you think are the most important to get answers to if we want to achieve our 2 year goal?"



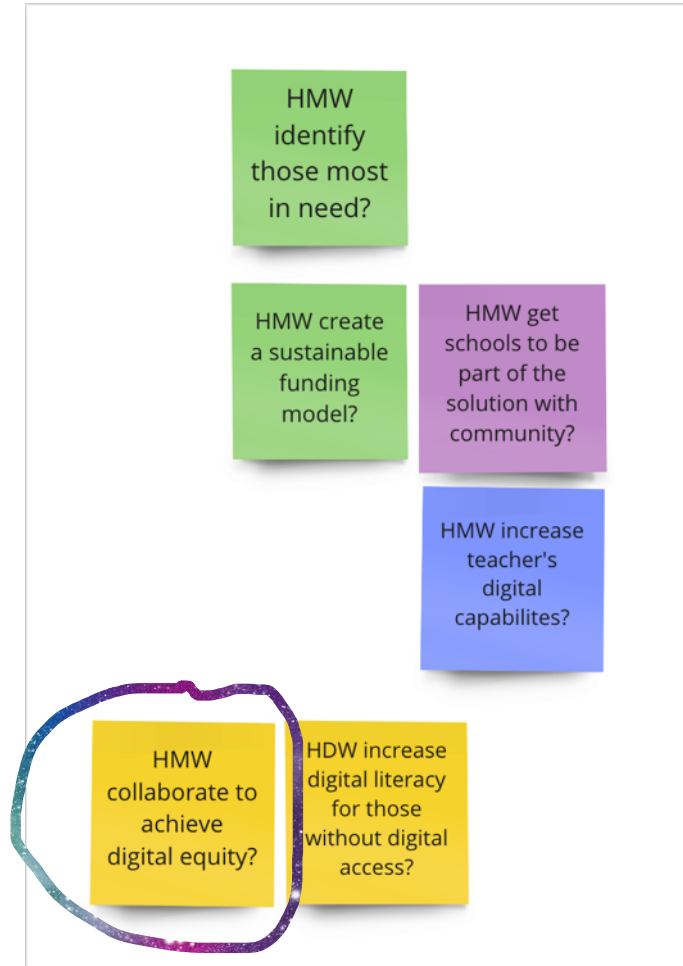

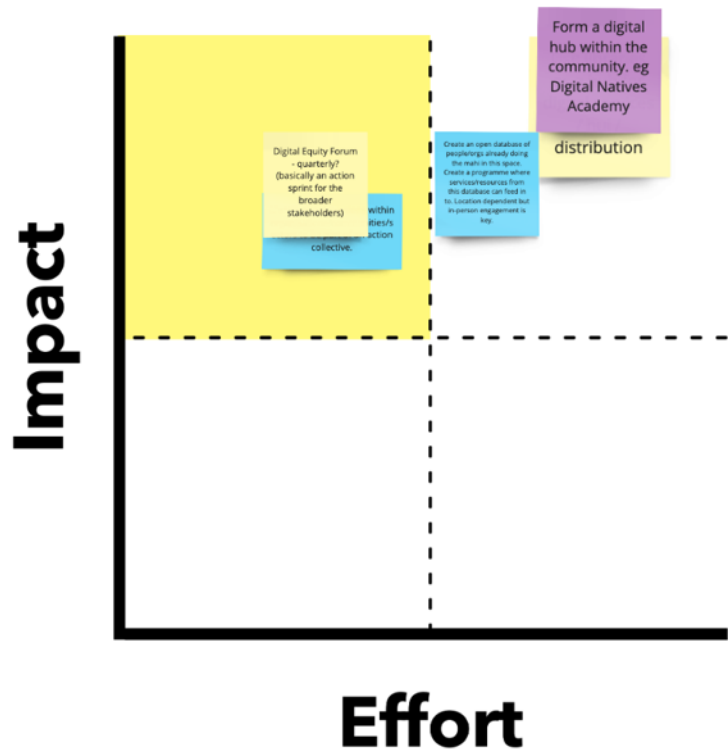

Decide what to execute on:

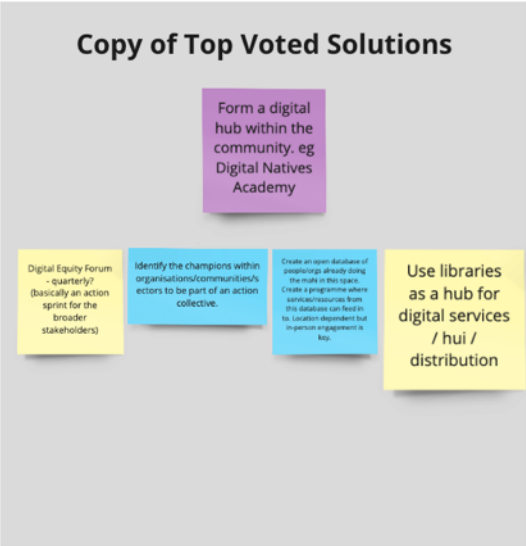
Prioritise the list of solutions, examine the impact versus effort and create action steps.

Digital Equity Forum

- A regular forum (e.g. quarterly) involving an action sprint for the broader stakeholders
- Identify the champions within organisations / communities / sectors to be part of an action collective.



Digital Equity Forum

Action Steps:

- 01 Identify organisation to champion or lead
- 02 Identify who to involve / invite
- 03 Articulating the purpose / compelling reason / the 'why'

Success Criteria: Does it happen? Success of the first session. Appetite to carry on

Create Open Database

- Create an open database of people / orgs already doing the mahi in this space.
- Create a programme where services / resources from this database can feed in to.
- Location dependent but in-person engagement is key.



Open Connection Database

Action Steps:

- 01 Identify who will take responsibility to drive initiative
- 02 Where will database be hosted? Could be built out of forum.
- 03 Overarching purpose. Private/Public use? Who is it for?

Success Criteria: How much it is used/ accessed. What does it lead to? Measure through evaluation, collaborations, stories.

Digital Hub within the Community

- Digital Hub in the community that supports children and youth (e.g. Digital Natives Academy)
- Mandated by the community
- Involving fully aligned partner organisations
- Using libraries and other community spaces as hubs.

Form a Digital Hub within the Community

Action Steps:

- 01 Identify greatest need. Establish whether a need or desire from the community itself.
- 02 Secure a funding mechanism.
- 03 Investigate where this is happening well. Replicate successes: e.g Community driven, support of wider organisations.
- 04 Identify champions already in the community. Pool the networks and contacts e.g contacts at the libraries.

Form a Digital Hub within the Community (cont.)

Success Criteria:

Secure a funding mechanism. Find a community partnership and trusted person from the community.

Does community turn up? Sustainability - at least for a period of 2-3 years.

Impact: greater digital literacy (e.g. stories, greater participation numbers)

What Next?

- Digital Futures and ConnectED project would like to be part of this mahi.
- Link in with GCSMs future plans for after ConnectED project is completed.
- GCSM, Digital Future, Ako Otautahi - connect up.
- Need to identify a key person from the community who could lead going forward (needs mana).
- Greatest need: Whole eastside of Christchurch. (e.g. Aranui, Linwood).

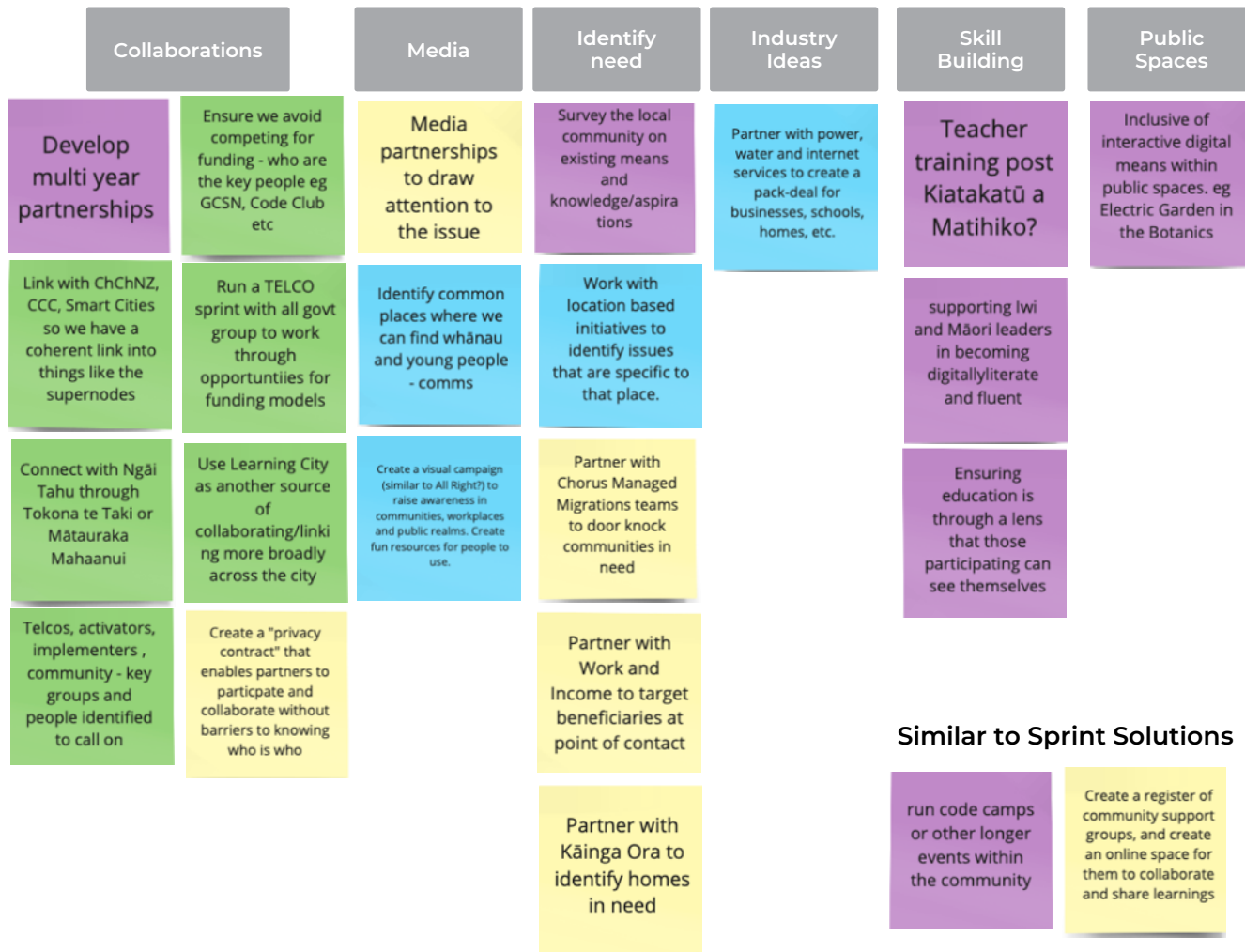

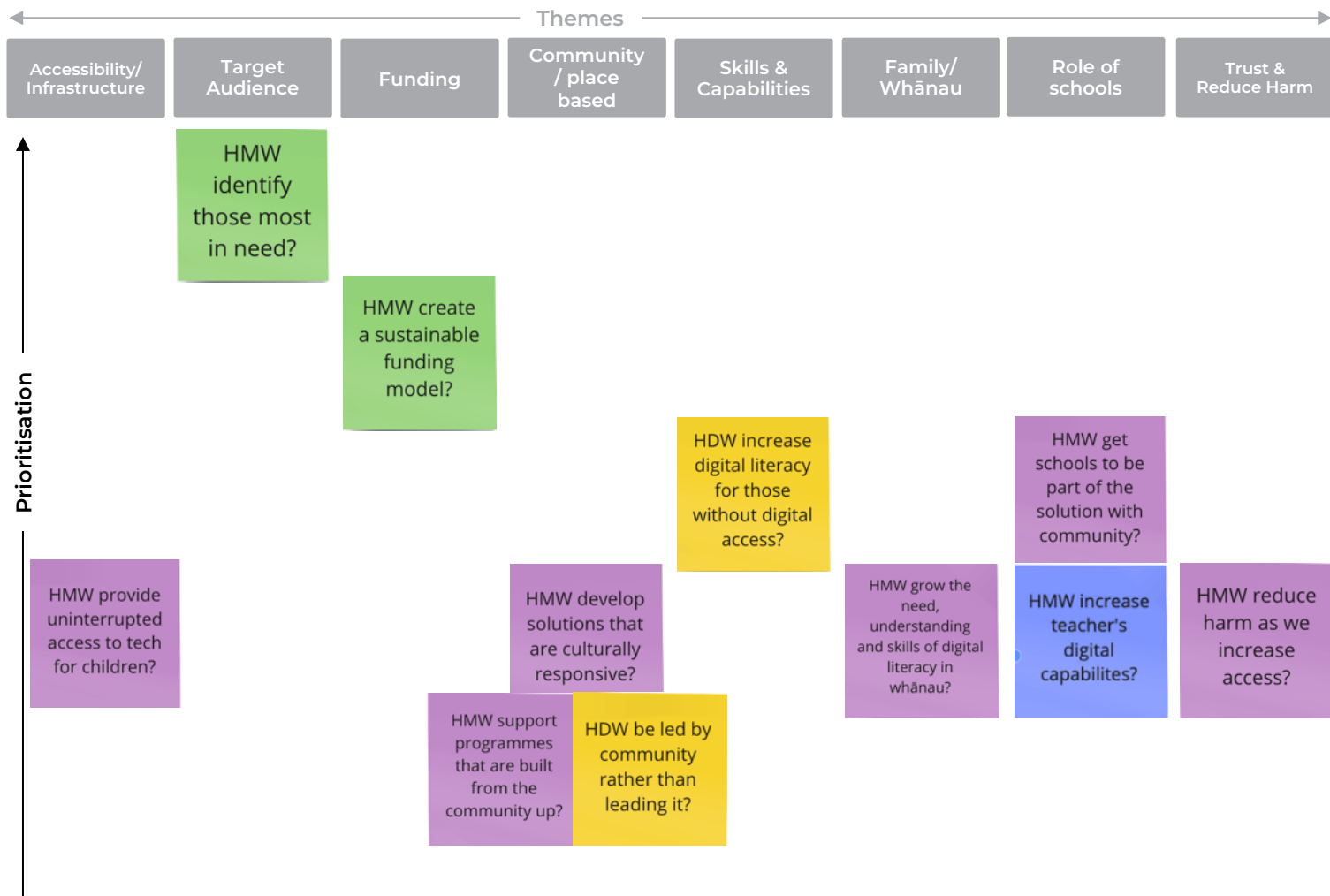
